- Halle grew up in Scottsdale, AZ, and while it wasn't a terrible childhood by any means, she spent most of her time dreaming of when she could leave. Her Mom is a former Afghan refugee and her Dad is an immigrant from Iran, so it was only natural that her background would become an integral part to her identity (and to her music). In fact, she incorporates Middle Eastern instruments into her music and wears Afghan jewelry on stage and in videos. However, Scottsdale is a predominantly white conservative town, so Halle never truly felt like she fit in with the rest of the crowd. She started singing as young as 5-years-old, and her parents always encouraged her to play piano and sing.
- Halle took her talents to California, where she is currently at USC pursuing a degree in Economics. While this isn't what she wants to do, her parents asked her to continue her education and she obliged. The access to Los Angeles has been helpful for her music, since she is now in one of the music capitals of the world. Halle was also recently accepted into the USC Thornton School of Music for Vocal Performance, which will only help her improve her skills.
- Halle was introduced to TikTok through friends and thought it was a great opportunity to post music, since it seemed like everyone else was doing it. She wrote and posted one of her first songs called, "Bad Bitches," which quickly racked up 1.3 million views. Since then, she has steadily posted viral video after viral video, earning nearly 50K followers and 1M likes in the process.
- She has yet to see a major pop artist in the United States represent Middle Eastern and South Asian culture – and she wants to be the first to do so. Her music carries a message of strength and resilience, and she's always seen it as her purpose to help others through music. The support on TikTok has meant everything to Halle and she knows she's close to moving to the next level. In the end, she desperately wants to prove to herself and to her parents that her musical pursuits were all worth the hard work and the sacrifices made along the way.
